During the week-long Inventuring 2.0 programme, students of Grade I-Grade 5 were introduced to a thought process where they learnt to look at 'problem solving'. They explored issues through an interdisciplinary lens, incorporating English, Math, and Theme. Through real-world experiences, they brainstormed solutions to age-appropriate problems and made observations, analyzed potential causes, summarized their findings, and creatively presented these to the wider community.



These experiences, integrating skills acquired from Art and Makerspace, enhanced their learning journey. They also dealt with grade appropriate problem statements which were connected to the current water crisis. They undertook experiments with a hands-on approach. Additionally, 'Immersive Learning' was experienced through field trips and guest lectures. The children also worked on the techniques of taking notes and this helped them to reflect on their learning. Their learnings were showcased to the parents and the Inventure Community at the Celebration of Learning (CoL) held on 7 and 8 June.
