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## STUDCO Elections at the Whitefield-Sarjapur Campus



This year the elections for the Student Councils, both for the Primary and Senior Schools were held at the end of June/early July. The process, as usual, began with the filing of nominations, followed by campaigning, during which period candidates engaged in various activities to promote their candidacy. This included giving speeches and creating posters and flyers on a limited budget, with the ultimate goal of persuading fellow students to vote for them and demonstrate their commitment to improving the school community.

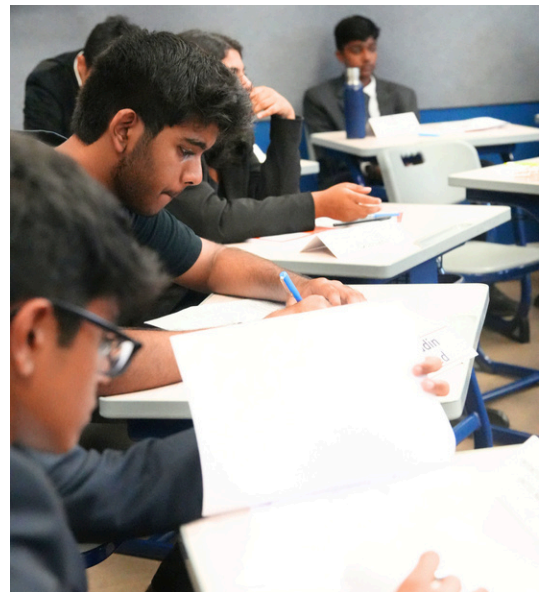
## Debate! Dialogue! Diplomacy! INMUN (Inventure Model United Nations) 2024



The Inventure Academy Model United Nations (INMUN) conference, now in its 13th year, took place on the 28th and 29th of June, 2024 at the Whitefield-Sarjapur Campus. This internal conference, exclusive to Inventure students from Grade 8 through Grade 12, served as a platform for students to engage in discourse on important issues both national and international, embodying the Inventure philosophy of empowering learners to become leaders and positive changemakers.

With over 250 delegates participating and numerous alumni returning for the conference, INMUN 2024 marked one of the highest number of Inventure delegate turnouts in the history of the conference. The event showcased an outpouring of talent, highlighting the critical thinking, camaraderie, and creativity that had been instilled in every delegate who participated in the conference.

This year's conference featured six Committees, delving into an intense set of agendas that affected the world. The All Indian Political Party Meet tackled the controversial agenda of the Uniform Civil Code, aiming to find a consensus on implementing personal laws that apply to all citizens equally regardless of their religion. On the other side of the world (*but actually just a few floors above!*), the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) harked back to the Persian Gulf Crisis of May 2021. The UNSC Committee challenged delegates to navigate the complex geopolitical landscape between Iran and the United States after the latter withdrew from the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action; the imposition of new sanctions against Iran, and the designation of the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps as a terrorist organization.



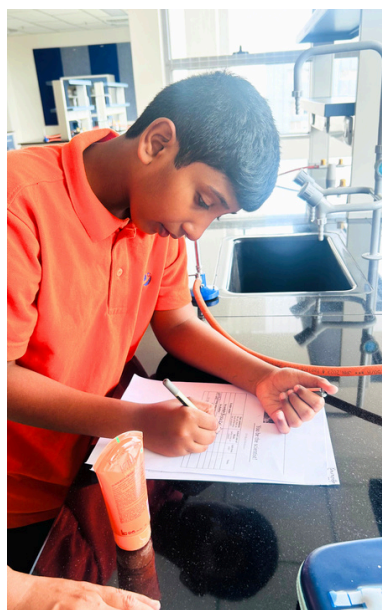
In a throwback to 1971, the Specialized Committee (Crisis) on the Bangladesh Liberation convened to urgently address the ongoing struggle for independence in East Pakistan, driven by cultural, political, and economic oppression. A land where cries for freedom were met with unspeakable violence. Next up on the roster, we had Committee X, which delved into the sinister world of the Italian Mafia post the Castellammarese War of the 1930's, with delegates donning period costumes to enhance the immersive experience!

The Social, Cultural and Humanitarian Committee addressed the surge in child soldier recruitment in the MENA region, and called for global solidarity and legal protections. Meanwhile, the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees focused on ensuring the safety of asylum seekers, highlighting the human right to seek asylum amidst global challenges.

As Secretary-General Aditya Narayan aptly put it, "INMUN 2024 explores agendas that allow us to reflect on our past to shape the future." The conference successfully created an environment that was conducive to high levels of debate, dialogue, and diplomacy, inspiring delegates to become the changemakers of tomorrow!

### **Middle Schoolers at Yeshwanthpur Campus Become UV Radiation Experts**

Our amazing Middle Schoolers at the Yeshwanthpur Campus just completed a critical project: Understanding UV Radiation and Sunscreen Protection. This was not your average textbook learning, but a hands-on practical exercise where students used their knowledge and curiosity to unlock the secrets of sunlight.



They reinforced their understanding of the electromagnetic spectrum, with special focus on an abundant resource – UV light. Through experiments, data collection, and some seriously cool 3D models and posters, students became experts on how UV rays affected our world, from sunburns to protecting plants and animals. They also used their Maths skills and analysed real-world UV index data and created graphs to test different sunscreens and SPF ratings.

The project was packed with fun facts and tips to keep students sun safe all year round, and they also learnt that animals such as Hippos actually secrete their very own pink coloured 'sunscreens'!

The Kindergarten 2 learners of Preschool, Whitefield went on a whirlwind adventure of self-discovery, exploring the amazing world of 'themselves'. Our little artists tried their hand at drawing portraits of themselves and celebrating what made them so unique.
