The entire Student Council of Whitefield-Sarjapur Campus had an unforgettable experience at the Leadership and Adventure Boot Camp hosted by the MU20 School of Opportunities. The Camp was held at the House of Lalpur in Punjab.

Over the course of the trip, the students made long-lasting bonds not just as team-mates but as friends. Dr. Sumer Bahadur Singh, an educator and thought leader, shared a plethora of interesting life experiences; everything from his interaction with Jack Ma to memories of his own Student Council at school, back in the day, and the importance of learning problem solving and decision making skills. He helped them to reflect on the current geopolitical situation and the choices world leaders have made, and also taught them about etiquette at meetings and how to make every interaction count. During the session with Mr Tejas Jain, the Founder and CEO of MU20 School of Opportunities, they delved into the skills and attributes that shape a leader and the cognitive biases that influence decision-making. They also had the honor of interacting with the MLA of the region and obtained his insights on the attributes of effective political leadership.

The experiences extended far beyond the conference room! With kayaking, trekking, bicycling, a scavenger hunt (where participants spread out and hunt for a predetermined set of items), and a visit to Dr. Sumer Singh's farm, they had the chance to work as a team on the ground. These experiences helped them learn how to coordinate and cooperate with each other in dynamic situations requiring spontaneous decision-making.





The students were accompanied by Nooraine Fazal (Co-Founder & Managing Trustee), Aparajita Dutta Banerjee (Coordinator-Student Affairs), and Preet Benjamin Aarons (Dean of Student Affairs) on their trip. They engaged with the students in absolutely every activity, be it conversing over lunch or playing Pickleball!

Inventure Students Make Waves at Oxford MUN



The students of Senior School, Whitefield-Sarjapur Campus participated in the India Chapter of Oxford MUN organised by MU20 School of Opportunities. This conference did not just comprise regular MUN sessions, but also an Innovation Challenge that aimed at identifying and nurturing the brightest young minds around the globe, who possess the capabilities to excel in diplomacy, public speaking, and policy-making. This Challenge comprised of 3 qualifying rounds, and of the 200 entries submitted, only the top 15 made it to the final round. From our delegation of 10 students, 5 participated in the Challenge.

There were a total of 5 awards for this Challenge and our students won 3 out of the 5 awards. Sia Saphira Bora, Arav Kumar and Rehaan Tarafdaar from Grade 10 did us proud. They also won a scholarship for this MUN.

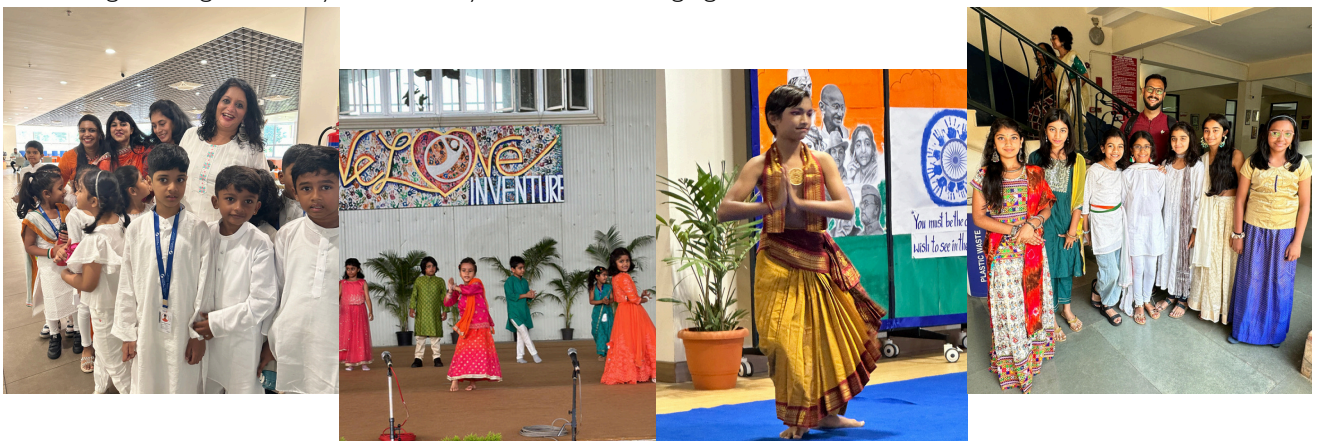
