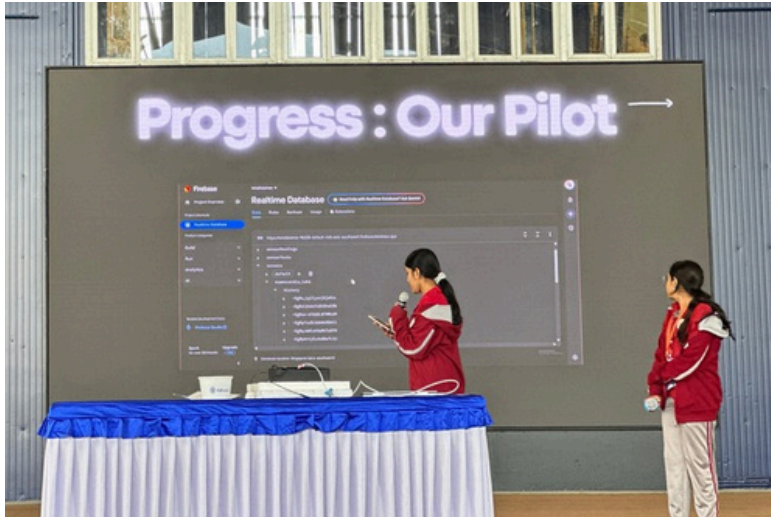

Changemaker Challenge 2025–26: Learning to Lead Change

The Changemaker Challenge- (flagship programme of IAWS) 2025–26 (CMC) was an important part of my learning journey as a student and as Changemaker Captain, I had the opportunity to contribute both behind the scenes in planning and coordination and on stage as emcee. This year's theme, *Life, Learning and Work in the Age of AI and Automation*, invited students to explore how innovation can remain human-centred while addressing real-world challenges.

At its heart, the challenge encourages students to think critically about problems that matter and to collaborate on meaningful solutions. With nearly 90 teams participating and over 250 individuals engaging as mentors, peers, and audience members, the experience reinforced that changemaking is a shared, iterative journey shaped by many perspectives.



Teams worked on a wide range of projects, from AI-driven tools to ideas focused on sustainability, financial well-being, healthcare, and road safety. Along the way, participants developed essential skills such as asking thoughtful questions, researching and synthesising information, communicating ideas clearly and building resilience when refining their solutions. There were many workshops that were organised by the CMC team to benefit the teams and streamline their thinking played a key role in helping teams challenge assumptions and navigate real world constraints. These workshops focussed from refine their problem statement to creating a meaningful and an impactful pitch.

The challenge also encouraged students to connect local issues with a global mindset, aligning their work with broader themes such as the UN Sustainable Development Goals and cross disciplinary learning. More importantly, it highlighted the power of student leadership and ownership within our community.

We hope the teams continue their changemaking journey by taking their ideas forward and staying engaged with issues that matter the most to them. The Changemaker Challenge is not just an event but a reminder that meaningful change begins with curiosity, collaboration, and courage.
