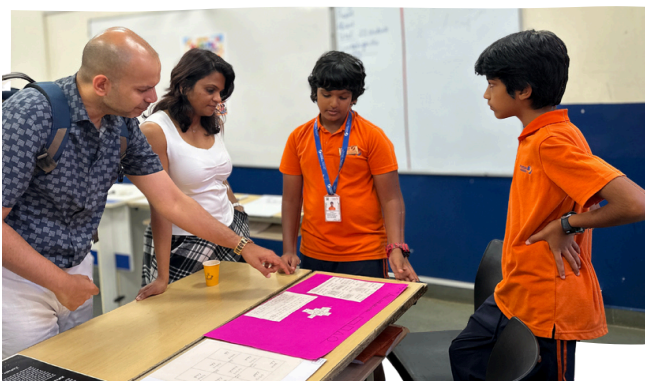

While they narrowly missed a Top 3 finish, the team secured the Consolation Prize, a testament to their knowledge, teamwork, and enthusiasm for science. Representing the school were Grade 8 students Pranav S, Ansh P, and Niara R, who rose to the challenge with confidence. The students visited the Indian Space Research Organisation on 28 February, celebrated as National Science Day, to receive their award, an inspiring experience that made the achievement even more memorable.

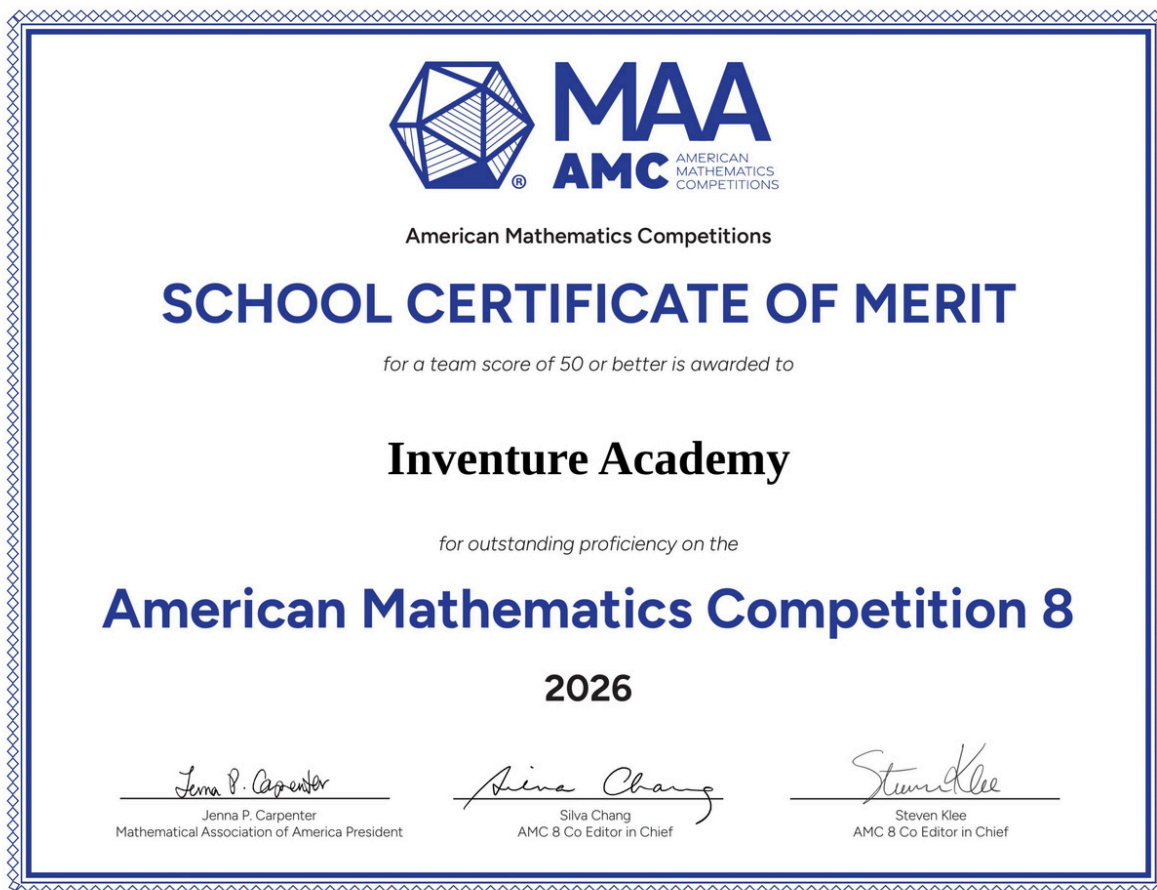


First-time hosting, outstanding achievement: Inventure Sarjapur shines at AMC 8 2026

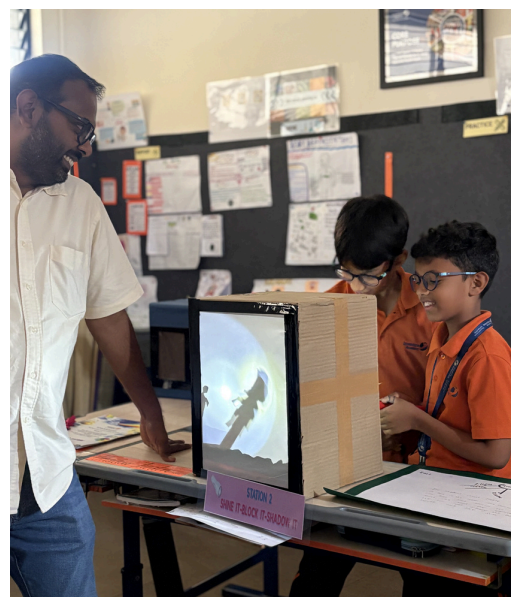
The visit offered students an engaging opportunity to experience scientific concepts beyond the classroom through interactive exhibits and immersive displays.
